We had another good showing for today's meeting at Züm Stammtisch. President Ingrid rang the bell promptly at 12:30 and began the meeting. She asked DPP Richie Huber for an Invocation, and he delivered an appropriate message about safety for all our first responders and active military. We recited the Pledge and sang our Patriotic Song. Pres Ingrid introduced the Past Leadership perfectly once again.

Today's Guests: Vin Arcuri had his aide Maria along; Rudy Jonke brought his wife Marilyn. Maspeth Kiwanis Club joined us for an Interclub: Glen Rudzewick, Ken Rudzewick, Tom Rudzewick, Barbara Rudzewick, and DPLG Mike Terry and his wife Lisa were with us.

Today's special guest speaker was the new *Commanding Officer of the 104*th *Precinct*, Captain Karan Chowdhury. He was joined by Detective Michael Berish of the 104 Community Affairs Council. After a rousing 'How Do You Do?', Captain Chowdhury introduced himself and gave us a quick bio. He is no stranger to this precinct, having been previously assigned here until 2012. He is happy to be back, and looks forward to working with all the community groups that he says "provide the glue that keeps our community strong". He turned the program over to Det. Berish, who gave us a rundown of recent crime statistics, and some common sense precautions everyone should take. He reported that:



- Tire and rim thefts are rising again, so securing your vehicles and investing in lug locks is a smart idea.
- Check washing is still a major problem. He suggested investing in special indelible ink pens, and doing your mailing at the post office if possible.
- Text and email scams are not going away anytime soon, so we need to stay vigilant, and avoid any attempts by scammers to request payments with gift cards or giving your bank account information.
- Package thefts are still a problem. Investing in a Ring camera or security system is a deterrent that works. Report any thefts to the precinct.

He also reported that the precinct staffing is approximately 25 officers short, due to supplying officers to Impact patrols on Roosevelt Avenue, as many other precincts are doing. Finally, the antiquated Mobile Command Vehicle is a hot topic that is an expensive problem to solve. It would cost roughly three quarters of a million dollars to properly upgrade it with state of the art technology.

It is always great to have the 104th Precinct join us, and we wish them well.

The *Fundraiser to Support the Aiello Family* continues to come together. DPP Richie Huber hosted a Bourbon Sampling event, and collected \$2000 in donations. The clubs of the Queens West Division continue to work hard on the *Dinner Dance* on Saturday, March 16th at St Helen's School Auditorium in Howard Beach. The dance will include a hot and cold buffet, with soft drinks served, BYOB. Great dance music will be provided by *Risky Business*. There will be raffle prizes, including two big screen TVs and an I-Pad, prize grids and a 50-50 offered. The cost will be \$85 a person, and the entire

proceeds will benefit the Aiello family. Tee shirts were also printed up and are on sale for \$20. The tickets for the 50-50 raffle were brought up to the NY District Mid-Year Conference in Albany, and making the raffle statewide should insure a large payout. The medical bills continue to grow for Carole Aiello's care, and we need this to be a big success.
