We had a wonderful look into the future at today's meeting. For the first time this year, our meeting wasn't run by a Past President. Our 'President for a Day' was *Anna Mastrolembo*, who is a Board of Directors member, and a nominee for President-Elect (more on that later).

She began the program in the usual manner, with Karen Kramer delivering a beautiful Invocation for Mother Earth. Then, after the Pledge and our Patriotic song, she introduced the Past Leaders in the room. Because she is new to the job, the fines were waived for incorrect introductions (she will soon learn what the word distinguished means).

Anna began her first program with a new twist. Past Presidents have always brought an opening with them to warm up the crowd, so to speak (IPP Ingrid's "Did You

Know?", DPP Steve Hansen's "On This day.." were some of the more recent topics). Anna was inspired to continue the tradition with the *National Day Calendar*. The calendar began in 2013 by Marlo Anderson to compile and share information about various national days, weeks, and months. Initially a hobby, the website quickly gained popularity, attracting millions of visitors and social media followers. It now features a curated list of celebrations, along with their stories and origins. Anna presented the celebrations for April 10:



National Sibling Day, National Farm Animals Day, National Cinnamon Croissant Day, National Hug Your Dog Day, National Erase Self-Negativity Day, and National Encourage a Young Writer Day. It is hoped that these light-hearted items can inspire us to think of ways to make life meaningful.

On April 22nd, the world celebrates *Earth Day*. It's a day to celebrate the environmental protection movement and raise awareness to protect the planet's natural resources for future generations. The first Earth Day was created in April 1970. Because there was no EPA, no Clean Air Act, no Clean Water Act, no legal or regulatory mechanisms to protect our environment, Senator Gaylord Nelson created Earth Day as a way to force these issues onto the national agenda. It has since become an international observance.

Our guest speakers today, Club Member Dorie Figliola and Mary Chin are curators of the *Glendale Community Garden* on 88th Street, a green space originally opened in 2010. From its humble beginnings, the program has grown to become both a beautiful, productive nature area and an educational opportunity for children and adults alike. Today, Mary and Dorie focused on the planting and growing of vegetables and flowers, and the composting program they are operating. At this time, they grow asparagus, mint, corn, okra, spaghetti squash, rutabaga and carrots, and donate the crops to the food pantry at Sacred Heart Church. They also grow zinnia, mums, lilies and irises to decorate the garden and neighbors' homes.

They have been composting for many years, and turn leaves and household food into rich, fertile soil, where they grow their crops in wood-lined beds. They host classes for local students and youth programs like the Girl Scouts, and teach the benefits of recycling waste into productive products, and planting techniques. Planting vegetables is usually safe around Mother's Day (mid-May). They will be hosting a "Seed and Seedling Swap" on May 17. If you have questions about gardening at home, these are the people to ask.

Our club has been sponsoring the Community Garden since the beginning, and we are thrilled to see what they are accomplishing.
