It was another gorgeous day weatherwise, and everyone who turned up today was in for a treat. Züm Stammtisch opened up the *biergarten* for the season, so we were

able to hold our first meeting outdoors. DPP Ingrid Huber rang the bell to get things started. She began the program in the usual manner, with Karen Kramer delivering a beautiful Invocation for safety in our community, and our protectors in the NYPD. Then, after the Pledge and our Patriotic song, Ingrid introduced the Past Leaders in the garden, with only one omission (Ingrid, we have a Pres-Elect named Anna).



Today's Guests: Vin Arcuri treated his aide Maria for lunch; DPP Big Bill Maher treated his wife Pat; Barbara Adams was her husband Richie's guest; DPLG Kerrie Hansen introduced her guest, NY District Foundation President Tom Poccio.

We had several guest speakers today. First up were two friends from the 104

Precinct Community Affairs Bureau, Det. Mike Berish and PO Mike Gonzalez. They were on hand today to give us an update on crime statistics, followed by some common-sense habits to get into. The crime report was mostly positive, although:

- Auto theft continues to be a problem, and the main concern is people continuing to leave their cars running and unlocked when running errands.
- Mail theft has become a bigger problem because mail box keys are readily available, and they are no longer fishing for letters, they just open the boxes and remove the contents. Det. Mike recommended taking your mail directly
 - to a post office, or handing them to your mail carrier. He also handed out pens that can be used to write checks, because they are difficult to launder.
- ATM crime continues to be a problem, because card readers are being glued to the machines and record the info on your card. PO Mike suggested using the ATMs inside the banks to protect your accounts.

Instances of AI fraud are on the rise, and it is difficult to detect, because they can record a voice and
create dialog that sounds authentic. He suggested that you should ignore any calls you do not
recognize. If the caller is legitimate, they will try to contact you in another way.

It was great to have our men in blue join us again, and we are grateful for all they do to protect our community.

Our special guest today was *Tom Poccio*, President of the New York District Foundation. He gave us a report on several of the projects the Foundation is currently running. The Kiwanis Key Club Scholarship committee is accepting applications. A graduating high school senior will receive a \$1000 scholarship. The Disaster Relief

has issued three \$5000 checks to aid wildfire and storm relief efforts in California, North Carolina and Florida. Tom then gave us a rundown on Kamp Kiwanis. He reported that the financials were positive, despite incurring nearly \$40,000 in winter snow damage, claiming a dining room refrigerator and the library structure. They have 290 Kampers paid for so far, and the staff is nearly complete. To achieve a balanced budget, prices have increased, because they would not



project donations that may or may not materialize. Also, the cost of transportation to and from the Kamp has skyrocketed.
