(It's Fun to Be German)

Today, we celebrated one of the most entertaining meetings of the year. We had a large crowd (39 members and guests) in the main room of Züm Stammtisch for *German Day*. DPP Richie Huber took another turn as 'President for the Day', and opened the meeting with an Invocation from Karen Kramer, and the Pledge of Allegiance and our Patriotic Song. When it came time to introduce our Past Leadership, he delivered what some in the room considered the weakest effort of the year. He literally could have filled the Sheriff's bag on his own, but we were having too much fun to call him on it.

Each year, we try to make the German Day program both educational and entertaining, and this year was no exception. With the help of our proprietor Werner Lehner, we introduced a truly Bavarian competition. DPP Richie began by talking about our favorite subject, BEER. He was wearing a tee shirt emblazoned with the words 'Ziegler Braü', an establishment in the town of Mainburg, a town of 15,163 residents in Bavaria where his father was born. According to Richie, Mainburg produces some of the finest hops in the world, which in turn produces some of the finest bier in the world. (Sounds like bragging).

Which brings us to today's competition. *Masskrugstemmen* (MAHSS-kroog-stem-men), otherwise known as Steinholding, is a traditional strength contest in which competitors hold a full one-liter beer stein out in front of their bodies with a straight arm. You hold it as long as you can, and the last person with good form is the winner. A full one-liter glass stein weighs approx. 5 pounds, and it is no easy task. There isn't a world-level competition, but the US record is considered to be 23 minutes, 40 seconds by some maniac in North Carolina. Werner set a table in the center of the room with two rows of glass steins, half-liter for the ladies, and one-liter

for the gentlemen. The ladies went first, and nine brave women gripped a stein and held it outstretched. After 6 minutes and 31 seconds, the winner was Marisa Beckmann. Then, it was time for the men to show their stuff. As you might suspect, the six daring souls were all of German descent.
